

Landsdale Christian School Uniform Policy

Rationale

The presentation of a student's school uniform helps to promote unity, equality, and equity among students. It is our belief that there are many benefits to students proudly wearing a correct and neat school uniform. A uniform is designed to:

1. Enhance student pride and ownership of our school.
2. Ensure that students begin on a level playing field and are not subjected to unnecessary judgement.
3. Provide students with a sense of belonging to the LCS community.
4. Help prepare students for the dress codes, professional standards, and PPE requirements of future workplaces, careers, and industries.
5. Allow students to be easily identifiable on and off campus to provide additional safety.
6. Provide a visual symbol of unity and agreement in the school's ethos.
7. Encourage students to take personal responsibility in presenting themselves professionally through dress, grooming, and personal hygiene.

This policy is designed to bring these benefits to all Landsdale Christian School students through a simple and clearly stated list of required uniform items and standards. This policy also provides appropriate and measured accountability protocols to inform and direct students and their families in the correct wearing of the school uniform.

Students at Landsdale Christian School are expected to always wear the correct uniform as instructed by staff, and outlined in this policy. This includes being correctly dressed and neatly presented upon arrival and departure on school days, whilst at school, and during House Carnivals, incursions, excursions, camps, and events.

Procedures

Uniform Infringements:

A uniform infringement is issued each time a student is out of uniform. Uniform infringements require that a student remains in the infringement room for the duration of recess, with students being dismissed five minutes before the end of recess to allow time to refresh and prepare for their next class. A student being out of uniform is commonly related to the wearing of uniform items incorrectly or wearing items in addition to school uniform, such as, but not limited to:

- Not having a hat in your possession during breaks in Terms 1 and 4.
- Not wearing a hat whilst in the sun during breaks Terms 1 and 4.
- Wearing coloured nail polish, artificial nails, artificial eyelashes or similar obvious cosmetic products.

- Wearing makeup in a way that is obvious or excessive in application.
- Boys' shirts being untucked when not practising physical activity.
- Skirts being worn or altered so that they appear to be shorter than 5cm above the knee.
- Jewellery that is worn outside of the specific guidelines set in this policy.
- Additional non-uniform items of clothing worn over or visible underneath the school uniform.
- Missing items of uniform.
- Not having the correct uniform to change into before or after practical classes.
- Items of uniform in poor condition.
- Items of uniform that do not fit appropriately.
- Items of uniform that have been modified beyond their intended use, graffitied, or vandalised.

Students may accumulate up to ten (10) uniform infringements in such ways in one calendar year. After the tenth infringement has been issued, the next instance (the 11th infringement in one calendar year) of a student being in an incorrect or incomplete uniform will result in the student being removed from classes and sent to the office. The student's parent or guardian will be contacted to return to school immediately to retrieve their child or correct the uniform infringement if possible. At this stage, the parent or guardian and school administration will discuss the student's uniform habits to attempt to resolve the issue.

After three (3) instances of a parent or guardian being called in (the 11th, 12th and 13th uniform infringement in one calendar year) any additional instance, within the same calendar year, of that student wearing incorrect or incomplete uniform will result in an administration meeting with the student and their parents or guardians to discuss the student's enrolment status at Landsdale Christian School.

Uniform Stickers:

When a uniform infringement is given, and the uniform issue cannot be immediately resolved, the student will be required to wear a uniform sticker. Uniform stickers are to be worn on the top layer of clothing, clearly visible on the front of the torso. A uniform sticker is designed to be visible to allow staff to acknowledge that a student's incorrect uniform has been identified and dealt with – providing the student with a means by which to avoid unnecessary attention toward their uniform throughout the day.

Additional notes:

- i. If a student's uniform becomes unsuitable to wear due to unforeseen circumstances, such as it being damaged or soiled after arrival at school, they must speak to the House Dean to negotiate a solution. Notification will be sent home to confirm the solution.
- ii. If uniform items are unable to be worn correctly due to medical circumstances, it is the responsibility of the parent or guardian to notify the school in a timely fashion. Medical conditions requiring a student to wear uniform incorrectly or incompletely will not contribute uniform infringements towards the accumulated total. LCS reserves the right to request a medical certificate in reference to the circumstance.
- iii. Communication from a parent or guardian regarding a student's uniform is encouraged. Parents or Guardians providing a letter or communication to exempt a student's uniform may exempt the student from sitting an infringement, however, the infringement will still count toward the accumulated total for that calendar year. The school has final discretion in such matters.

- iv. Students out of uniform will be required to wear a uniform sticker at all times. This applies to students that have been given an infringement and students given exemptions by a House Dean.
- v. Uniform stickers are to be worn on the top layer of clothing, clearly visible on the front of the torso.
- vi. It is the student's responsibility to correctly wear and care for their uniform sticker. If a replacement is required, it can be issued by any staff member at the student's request.
- vii. Failure or refusal to correctly wear or correct uniform, when it is practical to do so, may result in a consequence executable through the LCS Behaviour Management Policy.
- viii. Failure or refusal to correctly display and maintain a uniform sticker may result in a consequence executable through the LCS Behaviour Management Policy.
- ix. Landsdale Christian School reserves the right to make the final interpretation and decision regarding the intention of this policy when determining if a student is considered to be in breach of this uniform policy.

Prescribed Uniform

Landsdale Christian School has three variations of uniform: Formal Winter Uniform, Formal Summer Uniform and Physical Education (PE) Uniform. Details of the specific requirements of each uniform and its application are found in the tables that follow.

Uniform details - Boys

Formal Winter Uniform
High School Boys (winter) – white short-sleeve shirt with school logo, school tie, grey school trousers, long grey socks, formal navy school jumper, and school shoes. If a belt is worn, it must be black leather with a plain silver buckle.
Formal Summer Uniform
High School Boys (summer) – white short-sleeve shirt with school logo, grey school shorts, grey socks (must be above the ankle), and school shoes. If a belt is worn, it must be black leather with a plain silver buckle.
Physical Education (PE) Uniform
Students must wear the LCS branded PE uniform including a polo shirt, sports shorts or track pants, sports jacket and hat provided by the uniform shop. Other items of clothing are not permitted to be substituted for any of these components. Plain white socks must be worn and be above the ankle. Appropriate lace-up sport/running shoes (no canvas, skate, or a similar classes of shoes) must be worn.
Year 12 Leavers Jacket
Current LCS Year 12 Leavers Jackets may be worn at all times, except during formal school events or as otherwise determined by the school. Students who receive three or more infringements per term will have their jacket privilege revoked, resulting in its confiscation.

Uniform details - girls

Formal Winter Uniform
High School Girls (winter) – white short-sleeve shirt with school logo, school skirt, formal navy school jumper, white socks (above the ankle) or black stockings, and school shoes.
Formal Summer Uniform
High School Girls (summer) – white short-sleeve shirt with school logo, school skirt, white socks (above the ankle), and school shoes.
Physical Education (PE) Uniform
Students must wear the LCS branded PE uniform including a polo shirt, sports shorts or track pants, sports jacket and hat provided by the uniform shop. Other items of clothing are not permitted to be substituted for any of these components. Plain white socks must be worn and be above the ankle. Appropriate lace-up sport/running shoes (no canvas, skate, or a similar classes of shoes) must be worn. Current LCS Year 12 Leavers Jackets may be worn as part of the PE uniform by students in the current graduating Year 12 class.

Uniform Expectations - Girls

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Additional Notes:

Free dress days:

During 'free-dress' days, students are required to wear clothing that is respectful of the Christian ethos of the school. Students are not permitted to wear shoestring or see-through tops, clothes that expose the mid-riff, short shorts or skirts, skirts or dresses having open side seams that extend more than 5cm above the knee, or low-cut tops. The school's makeup policy as outlined still applies during free dress days.

If a student arrives in clothing that is deemed to be inappropriate, parents will be called, and the student will be required to organise a replacement set of clothing to remain at school.

House events:

During house events, students are allowed to substitute any item of clothing from the school PE uniform for a similar item in their House colour. These items must be appropriate in nature as outlined above.

During a swimming event, female students are allowed to wear a one-piece swimsuit or a rashie/shirt over a bikini. For modesty, when not participating in an event, ALL students must wear board shorts and a rashie/shirt.
